NURSERY

This half term we have been busy learning about dinosaurs.

We went on a **dinosaur hunt** outside and looked for the dinosaurs using our eyes. We found them in different places and used prepositional language to describe where they were hiding.

We spotted some **unusual eggs** outside and to the children's surprise, they had dinosaurs inside! They tried different ways to free them. We found out that ice is very cold and it takes a long time to melt.

You may have noticed the change in weather; we have had some rain and frost in the mornings. We have been doing safety checks with some of the children outside. One morning, we dried the slide to make sure it wasn't wet and slippery.





Over the last month we have also had lots of **new friends** join the nursery. Our new Terrapins have been exploring the home corner and making new friends. We would like to **thank** the children for making them feel welcome.









This half term, Year 3 have been writing non-chronological reports on **London.** We have used our mapping skills to locate London within the UK, and have researched the city and all the exciting things there are to do.

In Maths, we have explored **capacity and mass**. Using practical resources, we have learnt the difference between capacity and volume, and have looked at a range of different containers to measure the volume of liquid. We made our own "dirty" drink by each pouring 100ml of either tomato juice, orange juice, sparkling water or coke zero into the same jug. It looked revolting, but some of us were brave enough to taste a sip!









We have also investigated right angles, what they are and where we find them in our classrooms. The children have sorted out triangles, quadrilaterals and polygons and we challenged them to find the connection between squares and rectangles.

As our **Science** part of our **Where the Wild Things Are** topic, we have examined flowering plants. The children can now name the different parts of the flower and the responsibility they have in the life cycle of the plant. We pulled up some weeds and observed them through a magnifying glass to then draw them



carefully, and put white carnations in different coloured water (coloured with food colouring) to see if we can change the colour of the petals. The flowers in green have changed slightly, the others have been a bit disappointing! The children also spent a fun afternoon pretending to be pollinators, petals, anthers and stigma to simulate the process of pollination.













Continuing with our theme of plants, we have studied **Van Gogh's sunflower painting**. We found out some fascinating information about the artist, and then had a go at sketching our own sunflowers picture using his as a guide. We then used watercolours to recreate bigger versions, using Van Gogh's art as our starting point and then exploring our own interpretation of the sunflower painting.

If your child is not coming to school...

Please phone the school office between **8.30am and 9am if your child is not coming to school** and let us know the reason why. If we have not heard from you, you will either receive a text or a call from the admin team to find out where your child is. This is an important part of our safeguarding procedures. We will call a second time if you do not call back.

Is my child too ill to come to school?

We are sure it will help you decide whether or not you should send your child to school. Please remember that if your child has **sickness or diarrhoea**, they need to be **clear** of this for **48 hours** before returning to school.

If your child has **Covid symptoms** (cold, cough, temperature, sore throat, headache) we advise taking them for a Covid test.

Please make sure you let the office know if you change your phone number , email address or if you move house. *It can be very distressing for your child if they are ill and we are unable to contact you.* It will also mean that you may not receive urgent texts and emails sent by the office.

There is a full lost property box in reception which will be passed on to a charity shop if unclaimed. Please check it regularly if your child has lost anything. 

The children have been receiving Thrive lessons in class as part of their curriculum, as well as some children receiving group and 1:1 sessions throughout the week.

KS2 groups have been learning about parts of our brain and how it makes us act and how it helps us function. They created their own brain models using playdoh. 

In English, **Squirrels** and **Hedgehogs** have been reading, '**We're Going on a Bear hunt**,' and '**Beegu**,' this term. The children have been building up their writing skills in order to write words, sentences and paragraphs to make wonderfully descriptive texts.

In **Maths**, Year 1 have built upon their addition and subtraction calculations with numbers within thirty and have explored shape and space; pupils recognise familiar 2D and 3D shapes and can show repeating patterns in order to create geometric designs.

Year 1 classes have also had the opportunity to study the **United Kingdom** in topic work, where we have looked at the four countries, the flags, capital cities and some of the unique landmarks which make the UK a wonderful place to live.

Both Squirrels and Hedgehogs have continued to work hard in all subjects and through working together have made a wonderful team of teachers, TAs and Pupils.











Year 2 have worked really hard with their writing this half term and have been very engaged with their **'Home Sweet Home' Project**.


They have spent lots of time learning about, and researching, some of the most important **animal habitats** in the world, including: The Arctic, Deserts, Rainforests and Oceans.





They then used what they had found out to write a beautiful Non-Chronological report all about their chosen habitat which included information such as; the climate of their habitat, where it is and animals that live there.

We are very proud of all of the children and their efforts!



This has been a busy but exciting term for the **Year 4** children. Back in January, the children began the project by **designing and making their own chocolate bars**. Considering the indentation created when making a design or giving a purpose to the bar, challenged the children in their own thought process.



We were very lucky to have Lauren Willington (a local print maker) to share her expertise as we studied printing making in preparation to make our own chocolate bar wrappers. She discussed with us the tools and the process she uses when designing a new piece of art. We then took these skills and created our own bars.




















