


# Year 2: Here come the 1960s

Key Word	Image	Definition
Decade		A period of 10 years.
Audio cassette		A device that you could record sound onto and play it back.
Apollo 11		Apollo 11 (July 16–24, 1969) was American Spaceflight that first landed humans on the Moon.
Bell-bottom trousers		Trousers that became famous in the sixties. These trousers flared (go larger) at the bottom of the trouser leg.
Poncho		A cloak made of a square or rectangle with a hole in the middle for the head.
The Beehive		The beehive is a hairstyle. Hair is piled up in a conical shape on the top of the head and slightly backwards pointing. It got its name because it looks like the shape of a beehive.

The Sixties Timeline
<b>1960-</b> David Bailey got his first Vogue contract Coronation Street's first episode aired. Doc Marten's boots were first designed.
<b>1961-</b> Yuri Gagarin was the first man in space.
<b>1962-</b> The Beatles released their official debut single 'Love Me Do'. The first video game was created.
<b>1963-</b> Valentina Vladimirovna Tereshkova was the first female to travel into space. First cassette tape was made.
<b>1964-</b> 'Space Age' clothing came into fashion. BBC 2 went on air.
<b>1966-</b> The Monkees' released their first single, "Last Train to Clarksville" The England football team won the world cup.
<b>1967-</b> BBC 2 had the first colour channel on TV.
<b>1969-</b> The first moon landing took place.
