
Dear Parents/Carers,

Home Reading Books

We will also be sending home **Phonics Booklets** for children to practise reading and spelling CVC words and Tricky Words. Please try to complete at least a page a week.

Reading and Book Talk:

Reading is an important part of learning and developing children's vocabulary and language skills, therefore we encourage you to read **to** your child at home. This can be either in your home language or in English. It provides a great opportunity for you and your child to talk, and share ideas and thoughts about what they have read.

We want children to be happy and enthusiastic readers, and hope that children are able to read a variety of material including comics, poems and non-fiction to broaden their reading experiences. Please don't forget, whenever you read at home you should fill in a section of their Reading Record with brief details of what you have read. Children will bring their reading records home before half-term. They will get rewarded in class for reading at home.
