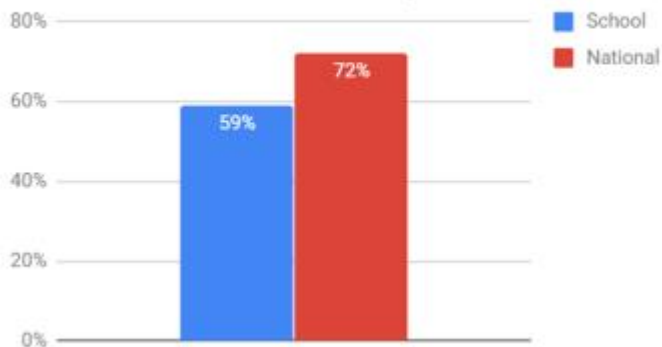
The best interests of the child must be a top priority in all things that affect children.

We hope that you too will be proud of your child's achievements.

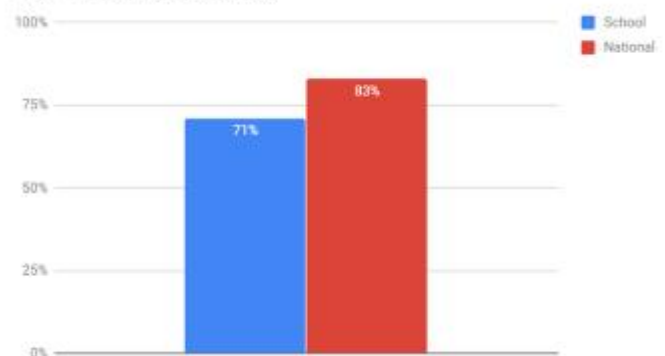
EYFS- Good Level of development



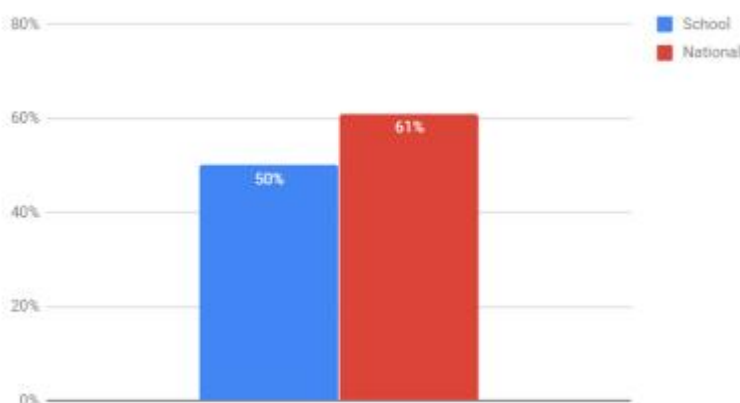

Year 1 Phonics Outcomes

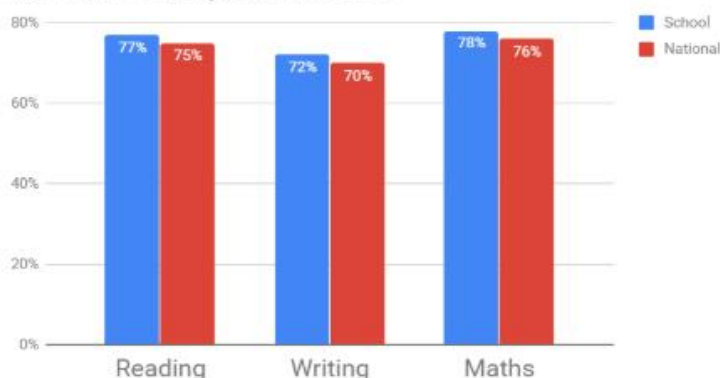


Year 2 Phonics Outcomes



We are also proud of our Year 2 children who took their phonics test.

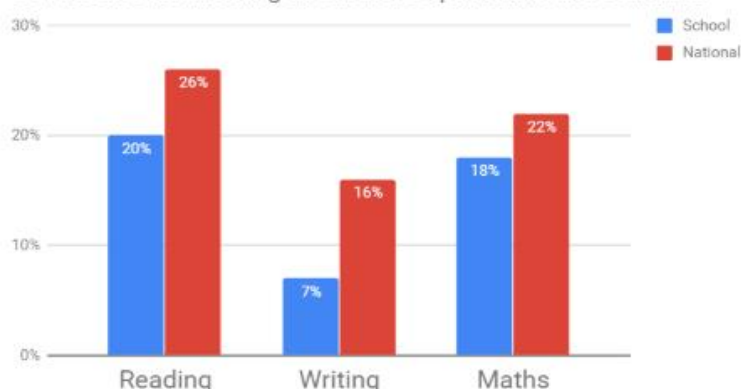
KS1 results for Expected Standard

- **Higher than the National outcomes for the Expected standard in Writing and Maths.**
- **Higher than National outcomes for children achieving the Expected standard in combined Reading, Writing and Maths.** This measures how many children achieve the Expected standard in all three subjects.
- **Improved outcomes for the Greater Depth standard in Reading and Maths.**

KS1 results for Working at Greater Depth within the Standard



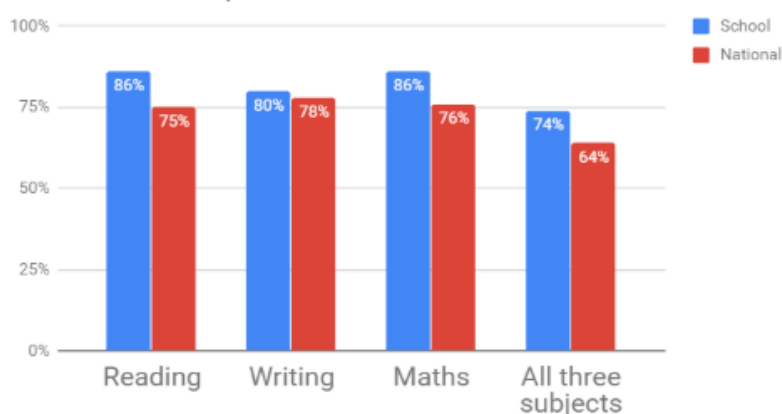
Our school priorities are to:

- **Increase the number of children working at greater depth in Reading, Writing and Maths to close the gap.**

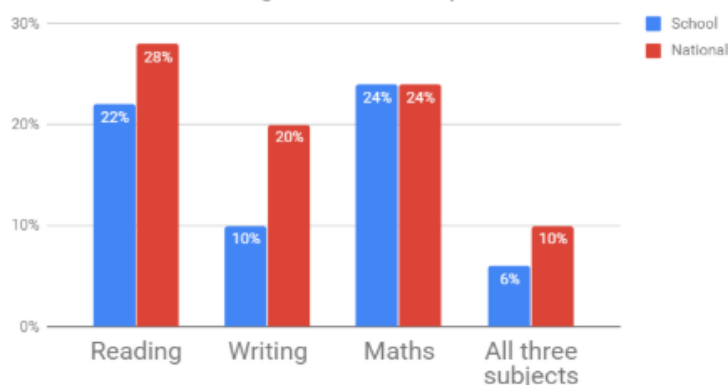
We are very pleased that our children achieved:

- **Above national outcome** for the percentage of children who achieved the **Expected Standard in Reading, Writing and Maths** combined. This is where children met the Expected Standard in all three subjects.
- **Above the national outcomes** for Reading, Writing, Maths and Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling at Expected standard.
- **Higher scaled scores** in Maths and Grammar, Spelling and Punctuation
 - scaled scores come from the marks the children achieve in each test
- **Met the national** in Maths at Greater depth
- **Better progress** in Reading and Maths than most children nationally, according to the floor target set by the government for progress made from Key Stage 1 (Year 2) to end of Key Stage 2 (Year 6).

We are sure it will help you decide whether or not you should send your child to school. Please remember that if your child has **sickness or diarrhoea**, they need to be **clear** of this for **48 hours** before returning to school. Online Payments and booking Parents' Evening online

Where possible, please pay online for trips and dinners - it saves you coming to the office and it saves us handling cash! If you haven't got an account, please come to the office for a password. This same account means you will be able to book Parents' evening appointments online.

Change of Phone Number or Address

Please make sure you let the office know if you change your phone number or if you move house. ***It can be very distressing for your child if they are ill and we are unable to contact you.*** It will also mean that you may not receive urgent texts sent by the office.

Lost Property

We continue to have a **vast** amount of unclaimed, unnamed school uniform. If **items are named** they can be returned to the child instantly. There is a full lost property box in reception which will be passed on to a charity shop in November if unclaimed. Please check it regularly if your child has lost anything. We would like an empty lost property box! Thank you.

E-safety Advice Page

This new section of our newsletter is designed to give you small snippets of relevant, up-to-date information and **guidance about how to keep your child safe online**. Our aim is to help children learn about the wonderful opportunities that the internet and technology give to our society. By working together, as a school and as parents, we can educate the children on how to enjoy these opportunities safely.

How you can help your child use online services safely

Have a discussion with your child about personal information. This is a great way for you to gain an insight into their understanding of the meaning of personal information. Specifically, it allows you to identify where there may be gaps in their knowledge or understanding.

- **Discuss with your child the range of online services that they use**, for example do they:
 - Use social media?
 - Have a YouTube channel?
 - Play online games?
 - Chat on web forums?It's highly likely they do at least two of the above (age-dependent) so this has the added advantage of understanding what they get up to, and why.

Creating a safe username

- **Discuss with your children what usernames they are using**, for example do they have the same u s e r n a m e across all the services they use, or do they have different ones?
- **Makes sure usernames don't reveal personal information.** Do your child's usernames reveal personally identifiable information that you're not comfortable with? (They should not contain their name, initials or date of birth) On rare occasions I have seen usernames that have a sexual reference (e.g. sexyeyes99). If you find anything like this get it removed and have a discussion about using names that are appropriate as this would be a specific risk.
- **Finally check their profiles are private.** Check their privacy settings and do a Google search together on their usernames to see if you find anything.

Creating a safe profile picture

- **Children should not have a picture of themselves as their profile picture.** Profile pictures still come up in internet searches and will allow people to identify your child. Instead, children can use a random picture as an avatar. An Avatar is a computer generated image to represent yourself. It can help to protect your identity when online.

Ask them about Lock it, Block it, Show it, Tell it.

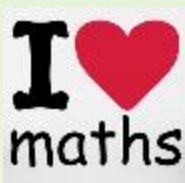
