| Try sketching your own cave paintings. Think about the type of drawings that were done and have a go at drawing your own.  | Have a look at this website giving some fun facts about the Stone Age. In the beautiful winter sunshine, head out for a walk and look at the frost on the grass. Where is the wildlife? If the rain continues, try making a circuit inside with press ups, squats, star jumps and running on the spot. How long can you keep going for?   | We will be writing a portal story this half term. Think about how you can create tension as your character falls down/through a hole. Have a go at writing the beginning of a portal story - create that tension as your character falls. Where do they end up? |
| Make a poster full of different colours and label the colours in Spanish. Get creative and see where your imagination can take you!  | Go on a right angle in your house, what can you find that has a right angle? Now, draw a picture using shapes that only have right angles in. What can you make? Is it difficult to only include shapes with right angles? Do all your shapes have to be regular shapes?   | On Google Classroom you will find a blank timeline from Stone Age to Iron Age with some events to order. Have a go and see if you can use the dates to order them correctly. Look closely at the dates - some are BC (Before Christ) and some are AD (Anno Domini or The Year of our Lord). You can cut them out and stick them or write them on the timeline. | Imagine you have a lot of rocks of different types to sell. Make a leaflet advertising them. On Google Classroom you will find a template for your leaflet and some information about different types of rock to guide you.                                     |
