## **E-Safety**

Back in February the school took part in the nationwide event Safer Internet Day. The theme this year was "Together for a better internet."

Over the course of a week all the children had the opportunity to discuss what the internet actually is and also to explore how young people ask for, give and receive consent online. This could be in their friendships or relationships, how they take and share images and videos or how they manage their privacy and data.

Whilst children are often aware that playing games with a friend on a games console or sending a message or email requires them to be "online", they are not always aware that watching BBC iplayer or speaking to an Amazon Echo, could also mean they are still "online" and therefore still need to be careful with the information

they share.



Year 1 explored all the devices that could be connected to the internet and had a go at building their own before discussing what they should do if something they were unsure about popped up on a computer screen.

Year 2 explored what sort of information would be OK to share online and what should be kept private.



**Key Stage 2** looked at the concept of giving and receiving consent in more practical ways online, such as when sharing pictures using social media, or sharing contact details. They also discussed the consent they are giving to third parties when signing up for online accounts.

In the fast changing world that we live in today it is increasingly important to have regular conversations with your children about the technology they have access to and encourage them to be open and aware of any risks.








## Early Years needs you!

## Science Week 2019

The **11th—15th March was Science and DT week** in Shirley Warren! The theme of the week was **Journeys** with each year group having their own stimulus to explore.

**Year R** - Looked at tunnels: thinking about what makes a good one before constructing their own.

**Year 1** - Looked at bridges: thinking about what materials would be best before creating their own that would have to carry the weight of a beebot.

**Year 2** - Looked at static electricity and how it could transport the paper animals they made.

**Year 3** - Found out about the important role bees play in pollination and then created their own digital animations to show this.

**Year 4** - Investigated forces and the effect they had on the fabulous flying machines they created. They then used ipads to create their own explanation videos.

**Year 5** - Found out all about scientists that had visited space.

**Year 6** - Had two mini projects of their own; 6L Investigated natural disasters whilst 6W looked at the journey of diseases before creating their own viral videos.

The children thoroughly enjoyed practically investigating these areas and learnt lots during the week! Special mention needs to go to the ambassadors from each class that stood up in a special assembly at the end of the week and shared what they had been doing; they were fantastic.

## LiNX Groups

The LiNX programme was devised originally for children that had experienced Domestic Violence and had gone on to commit crime due to the trauma they had experienced, leaving them with little or no empathy for others or themselves. It is based around the Empathy Wall with the intention to show how if different parts of the wall are missing it will be unstable and fall down. By rebuilding the wall, giving the child confidence, building their self esteem and self worth it allows them to reach their full potential. The age group is between 10 and 18. Single sex groups and age specific 10 -12yr olds, 16-18yr olds etc. Due to the success of the programme it is also used for children with behavioural problems.
