Dear Parents and Carers,

This half term has gone by so quickly and the children have experienced lots of amazing opportunities which are celebrated in this newsletter.

The autumn term is when we identify and plan to improve areas in school. **Attendance** is an improvement focus for us and we have set a school target of children missing no more than 3% of their learning time. This is a target of **97%** attendance. We are also focussing on reducing the number of pupils who are persistently absent. These are children who have missed over 10% of their learning time and they are often supported by the local authority's Education Welfare Officer. We are introducing additional rewards to celebrate the good attendance of children who come to school every day.

We are also looking forward to achieving our Health School's Award and Rights Respecting Schools Award at gold level.

Thank you for your patience and understanding during our buildings work which is ensuring we have a watertight roof. During this time it has meant we can only use one of our gates. The scaffolding may be taken down over half term if the work continues to stay on schedule.

Just a reminder that we do not allow children to use the climbing equipment before or after school as this is not a time when school staff are supervising safe use. Each climbing station is designed for a specific age range and is unsuitable and so potentially unsafe for different age ranges.

A huge **thanks to our PTA** for all their hard work this half term. The Halloween discos have been a huge success and the children had a great time.

## 16th - 20th September E-Safety Week

Lock It, Block It, Show It, Tell It is a strategy with an easy to remember slogan to promote online safety to children and their parents.

### Lock It

This is about keeping personal information secure: usernames, passwords and personal details.

### Block It

This is about blocking rude or nasty messages. It's about blocking bad websites, not downloading anything you're unsure about, and not clicking on any links or pictures you don't know about.

### Show It

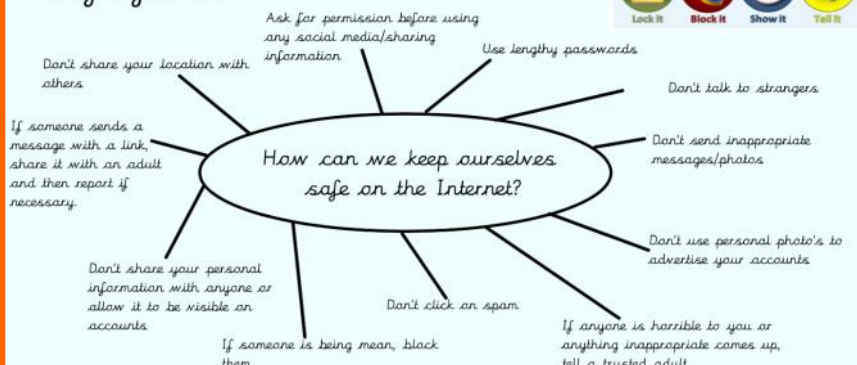
This is about showing an adult if you come across anything that makes you feel uncomfortable or is inappropriate. This could be a website, a picture, a message or a video.

### Tell It

This is about telling an adult if you feel you are being bullied or upset online.

We have been busy in **year 6** discussing what constitutes e-safety and how we can keep ourselves safe on the internet. We started our discussion by considering what e-safety means and how we can keep ourselves safe. Here are some of our considerations:

#### E-safety week!



We had fun in **2S** this week learning all about how we create a digital footprint when we are online and how it can be difficult to change or erase this. We soon realised that we need to be very careful when using the internet in order to keep ourselves safe and respect other people's feelings. With our talk partners we came up with lots of great ideas about the sort of information we should keep private (like our passwords, address, names, photos etc) and designed our own footprints to create a display to share our advice with the rest of the school.

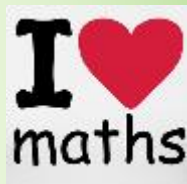

## Fantastic start to Phonics Friday in Year R!



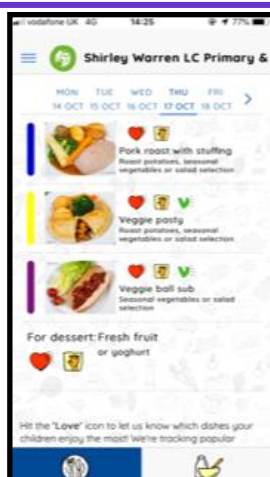
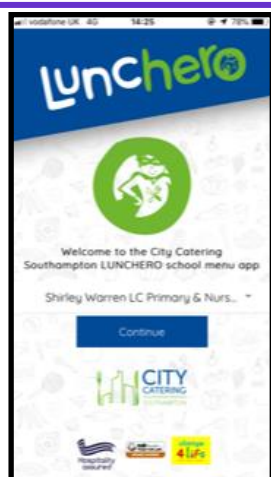
### Phonics Fridays
