

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Key Facts
Florence Nightingale was born in Florence, Italy in 1820.
She grew up in London and had a privileged upbringing.
Her family did not want her to be a nurse, despite this she trained as a nurse in 1837.
She is most commonly known for her role in the Crimean War, 1854.
She is known as lady of the lamp.
She improved the hygiene standards in many hospitals.
She received the Order of Merit (1907) and Royal Red Cross (1883) for her contributions to nursing.
She opened her own nursing college, Nightingale training school in 1860, called 'Nightingale training school for nurses' in London.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 1820: Born on May 12th in Florence, Italy</li> <li>• 1837: Begins training as a nurse at the age of 17</li> <li>• 1853: Appointed superintendent of the Institution for the Care of Sick Gentlewomen in Upper Harley Street, London</li> <li>• 1854: Sent to Scutari (now Üsküdar, Turkey) during the Crimean War to oversee nursing care for British soldiers</li> <li>• 1856: Returns to London and publishes her book "Notes on Nursing"</li> <li>• 1857: Founds the Nightingale Training School for Nurses at St. Thomas' Hospital in London</li> <li>• 1859: Publishes "Notes on Hospitals"</li> <li>• 1868: Introduces the first official nursing register in England</li> <li>• 1910: Dies on August 13th in London</li> </ul>
