## Geographical Skills and Fieldwork

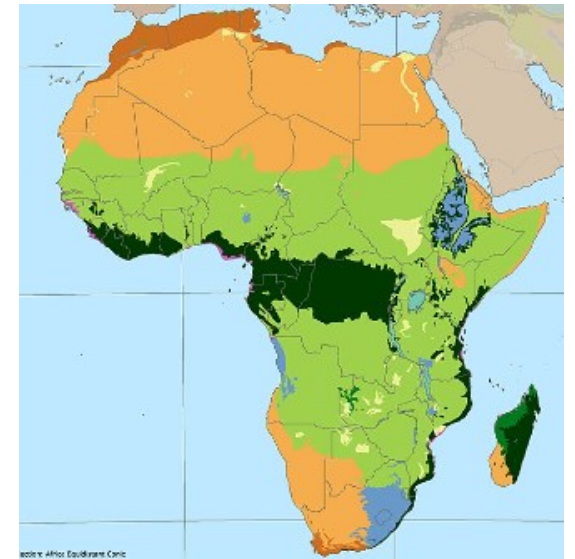
We will be developing our map reading skills.

## Direction and Location Vocabulary

Key Word	Definition
Great Britain	The countries of England, Wales and Scotland make up Great Britain.
United Kingdom	The countries of Great Britain plus Northern Ireland make up the United Kingdom.
Continent	any of the world's main continuous land masses
Country	a nation with its own government
Landscape	all the visible features of an area of land
habitat	the natural home or environment of an animal or plant
Physical geography	The features that are naturally in the environment, for example, mountains and rivers.
Human geography	Man-made features in the environment for example, roads and buildings.

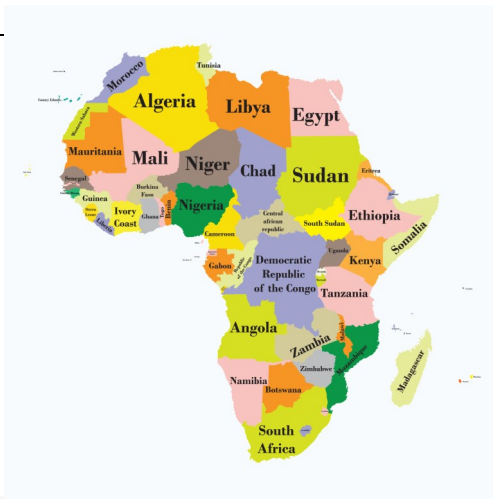
