Christmas Jumper Day


This year the school was awash with the most colourful Christmas jumpers on 13th December as we joined in with the appeal organised by Southampton Hospital. It was a wonderful sight!

A Guide to E-Safety This Christmas...

With Christmas literally around the corner we all know that children love to play with any device that connects to the internet and with this there always comes an element of risk. To help you, we have put together a small list of **top tips** that will help you to keep your children e-safe this Christmas and New Year.

Security

• Help your children to set up their accounts on their new devices and make sure that their settings are set to private.

• Take the time before Christmas Day to **read the manual** and get to grips with security and privacy options. It is always best to set up a 'two-factor authentication' process when logging in to any online service.

• Some toys and devices like the Nintendo 3DS, Switch or the V-tech Camera Zoom are fitted with web cameras – you can **turn the remote viewing option off** in the device's settings.

Passwords, Parental Control and Age Restrictions

- Some toys and devices have been found to have unencrypted Wi-Fi connections or unsecured Bluetooth connections. If this is the case, add a secure password or a PIN. Ensuring that passwords are **secure** is **fundamental** when protecting your children.
- When creating a password, remember to set up unique passwords for new accounts these should include a mix of capital letters, lower case letters, numbers and symbols.
- If setting up new devices like tablets, Xbox's or even mobile phones for children, the parental controls should be activated to help prevent them from viewing content or engaging in activities that they shouldn't be.
- **Take interest in your child's online activities.** Play with them on their devices and encourage open conversation to help build that trust and confidence that will mean your child can confide in you if they ever feel uncomfortable, troubled, worried or unsafe. Our children at Shirley Warren are very good at saying when something online doesn't feel right. We use the easy strategy **`Lock it, Block it, Show it, Tell it'** to help children remember.
- All games and apps have age restrictions. It's important that you make yourself aware of these age restrictions and WHY they are in place. Remember that apps like Facebook, Instagram and Snap Chat all have an **age restriction of 13**. This is to help protect children from viewing content that is inappropriate.
- If you feel like your child is either spending too much time on their devices or maybe taking part in inappropriate activities, it's not a bad thing to be strict, set boundaries and occasionally remove the device.

Is my child well enough to come to school?

These are the guidelines we have to follow, provided by the **NHS Healthier Together** website. It is useful information as to whether you should keep your child off school or not. So this hopefully will save you phoning to ask whether your child should come in! If you are unsure, often it is easier to bring your child in and we will always phone you later to collect them if they are really not well enough to be in school.

Athlete's foot	None	Athlete's foot is not a serious condition. Treatment is recommended.	
Chicken pox	Five days from onset of rash and all the lesions have crusted over		
Cold sores (herpes simplex)	None	Avoid kissing and contact with the sores. Cold sores are generally mild and heal without treatment	
Conjunctivitis	None	If an outbreak/cluster occurs, consult your local HPT	
Diarrhoea and vomiting	Whilst symptomatic and 48 hours after the last symptoms.	See section in chapter 9


Congratulations to Class 6M for the best attendance this term - 97.7% !
