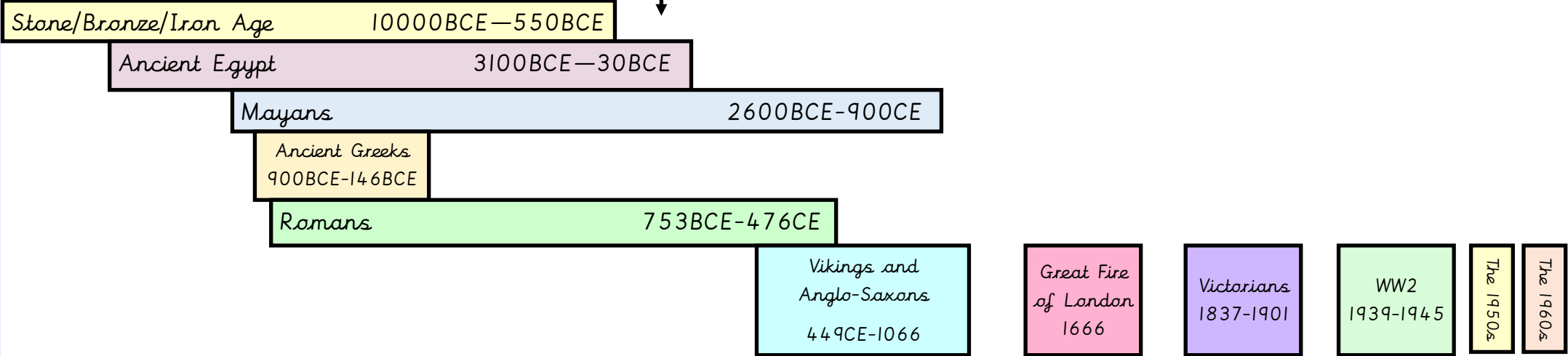

Cause and consequence	While investigating mummification, we explore the reasons behind the process and the meaning it holds.

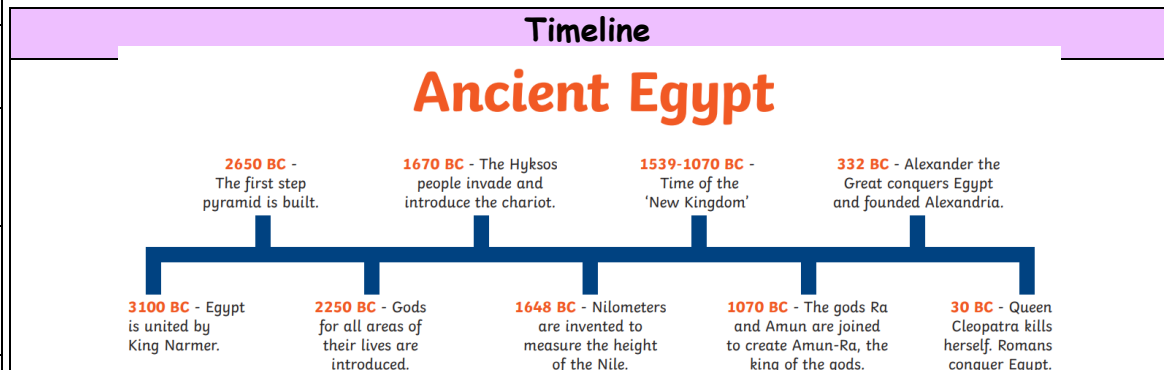
Key Facts

Archaeologist		A person who studies human and pre-history through exploring artefacts.
Hieroglyphics		The communication system that uses symbols.
Cartouche		A carved tablet with inscriptions.
Papyrus		Paper and materials made from the stems of water plants.
Mummify		The preservation of a body by wrapping it in cloth.
Canopic jar		A covered urn used to store body parts after mummification.
Scribe		The qualified person who recorded information by writing.
Civilisation		The term given to a human culture and time.
